They (Lake County Commissioners) have thirty days to file their motion asking the Court of Appeals to change their opinion, and then they have thirty days to file a petition for transfer to the Supreme Court. It's a historic decision regarding jurisdiction and interpretation of the home rules statute that we've lived under now for about forty-two years."
