WHEREAS: That the other Local Government Units in Lake County currently operate individual PSAPs:

WHEREAS: That some or all local government units, in conjunction with the Lake County Board of Commissioners, are interested in combining their respective resources into a joint venture to consolidate the dispatching of fire, ambulance and law enforcement services in an effort to provide for the effective and efficient operation of such a system by developing an interoperable communication system.

WHEREAS: The City of Gary has determined that it will participate in the consolidation of PSAPs (hereinafter referred to as "consolidation process") with other local government units and the Lake County Board of Commissioners and that said process will involve a significant capital expenditure for the City of Gary;

NOW THEREFORE, in anticipation of the consolidation of PSAPs by December 2014, as required by State law, the parties hereto enter into this Funding Agreement for 2011 which has the following terms:

- 3. The Lake County Board of Commissioners agrees to provide operation funds for 911 operators for 2011 as follows: \$166,666,00 on or before March 31, 2011; \$166,666.00 on or before June 30, 2011 and \$166,666.00 on or before September 30,
- 4. Funding by the Lake County Board of Commissioners will be made on a reimbursement basis after presentation by the City of documentation of expenses
- The Lake County Board of Commissioners is not committing funds other than 911 funds to reimburse the City of Gary.
