- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-3.5-5, the County Council shall adopt ordinances to promote efficient County Government; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-2-5-2(b), the County Council shall appropriate money to be paid out of the County Treasury, and money may be paid from the County Treasury only under appropriation made by the County Council, except as otherwise provided as law; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 36-1-8-4, the Lake County Council may by ordinance or resolution transfer money from one fund to another; and
- WHEREAS, the Lake County Council desires to establish by ordinance all funds within the County Treasury, from which appropriations and transfers require County Council approval; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to I.C. 33-37-8-6, the Lake County Council desires to create the Ordinance Violation Deferral Program Fund for the deposit of fees collected by the Lake County Ordinance Violation Deferral Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That pursuant to I.C. 33-37-8-6, the Lake County Council now establishes the Ordinance Violation Deferral Program Fund, a non-reverting fund, established for the deposit of fees collected by the Lake County Ordinance Violation Deferral Program created pursuant to I.C. 34-28-5-1.
- 2.
