FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Lake (the "Board") has reviewed the need for the construction of improvements to a facility and the installation of equipment in the facility to provide emergency 911 services throughout Lake County, Indiana (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that there will be an insufficient amount of money on hand or in the course of collection to meet the current needs of the County for such improvements and equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Board now finds that an emergency exists to borrow money with which to fund the costs of such improvements and equipment and that bonds should be issued and sold, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein and in accordance with the provisions of Indiana law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE as follows:

It is hereby found and declared that an emergency exists for the borrowing Section 1. of money with which to fund the costs of improvements to a facility located within the County and the installation in the facility of equipment necessary to provide emergency 911 services throughout the County, and therefore, the Council is hereby advised to issue bonds in the amount of not more than \$21,000,000 pursuant to the provisions of IC 36-2-6-18 and 19. The Board recommends that the bonds shall be dated as of the date of delivery thereof to the purchaser thereof. The Board further recommends that the bonds shall mature on January 15 and July 15 over a period ending not later than January 15, 2030, and that debt service on the bonds be payable from a portion of the County's public safety tax which, based upon preliminary numbers presented to the Board, appear to be sufficient to pay debt service on the bonds. Based on these preliminary numbers, the Board reasonably expects that the County will be able to pay debt service on the bonds from funds other than property taxes that are exempt from the levy limitations of IC 6-1.1-18.5 even though it will be in the County's interest and the interest of the County's taxpayers to pledge to levy property taxes to pay debt service on the bonds if those other funds are insufficient in any year as that pledge will lower the interest rates on the bonds, and the Board recommends that such pledge be made.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Council is hereby directed to consider the adoption of an ordinance authorizing the issuance and sale of the bonds. Upon receipt of the authorizing ordinance, the Board shall take action to adopt a Final Order to proceed with the sale and delivery of the bonds in accordance with the provisions of Indiana law.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE

WHEREAS, the Lake County Council approved the issuance of bonds of Lake County, Indiana (the "County") for the purpose of providing funds to pay claims against the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted a Final Order and Supplemental Final Order approving the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$8,000,000 payable from gaming revenues to be received by the County and property taxes if the amount of revenues were insufficient; and

WHEREAS, Judgment Funding General Obligation Bonds of 2012 (the "Bonds") in the amount of \$8,000,000 were sold on December 13, 2012, to fund the judgments against the County, including a class action lawsuit that required that money be deposited into the fund to pay all claims covered by the lawsuit; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been advised that following payment of all claims submitted in the class action lawsuit, a surplus of approximately \$62,000 will be returned to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received a certification from the County Auditor that the surplus was not anticipated at the time of issuance of the Bonds, and the Board must take action to approve the use of the surplus pursuant to Indiana Code 5-1-13-2; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines that it would be in the best interest of the County to use the surplus to pay other judgments entered against the County which is the same purpose for which the Bonds were originally issued, and the proceeds could be used to pay debt service on new judgment funding bonds if new bonds were issued to fund such judgments;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF LAKE the Board hereby approves the use of the surplus of the proceeds of the Bonds to fund other judgments entered against the County subsequent to the issuance of the Bonds.
