Comes now, Present Repay, allow some Consultants to come forward and speak, first to speak Sam Weber with VS Engineering with presentation on Sewer Project in Calumet Township, they were asked to review this area where no public sewer system is available and at some point for quality of life we have to get a public sewer system in there, complaints have been made in the past years, contaminants have been found as a result of a failing septic system, which raises red flags, the need for a public sewer system in this area is definitely considerable, they were asked to understand and determine Phase 1, this project will likely be done in phases, the most dense area allowing the most residents to be served, this initial Phase 1 will service about 700 acres, about 35thousand feet of sewer about a third of the entire project, construction cost estimate 35million including all the manes and connecting residents, right of way some may need to be purchased some public, grand total overall 42million, schedule on this project money needs to be spent by 2026 as the final deadline, working back 2year construction 2023-2025, complete land acquisition and bid project early 2023, design phase early 2022 pending approval from Council and Commissioners, Sam asked if anyone had questions.

Commissioner Repay, spoke, stating, one of the things we all thought was important is to let everyone see what we've been working on and thank you for your work thus far, and Doug will speak on the financial aspect.

Comes now, Doug B. with Bakertilly Municipal Advisors to speak before the Board, in regards to Lake County, Indiana Recovery Plan, stating that they have been assisting the County with the American Rescue Plan Funds, that have been received, the American Rescue Plan Act provided significant once in a lifetime funding to your local communities to help stimulate the economy and combat the negative results of the COVID-19 Pandemic, Lake County was awarded a little over 94million dollars in Recovery Funds, the main points of the recovery plan, all units of Government has to have a plan of how they're going to spend their money, Lake County based on population has to have a more in-depth recovery plan, broken into allowable uses, planned uses, benefits of Sewer Infrastructure Projects, Recovery Plan Preliminary Budget, Funding for Sewer Infrastructure Projects, and the Next Steps. Attorney Fech asked Doug if he would discuss how the funds are distributed. Doug, replied, yes approximately half of the funds were distributed by the Federal Government directly to the County, which has been received already, the other half is supposed to come approximately 12months after that, so next year. Doug, continued, speaking on the planned uses, why invest in infrastructure and preliminary budget.

Comes now, Commissioner Tippy, to speak, giving background on the sewer and septic system in Center Township a study that the Army Corp of Engineers years and the DNR has resurrected the studies and has identified a considerable amount of sanitary infiltration into our ditches, streams, etc. all of our water ways, something needs to be done, the Army Corp of Engineers identified nine (9) subdivisions within Center Township, as a Committee five (5) have been determined top priority, the base project of the five subdivisions comes to 25million dollars estimated, NIES Engineering is our engineering consultant for that particular project, it will not happen without cooperation from the City of Crown Point, discussions have been had with the Mayor and his staff and have come to an agreement and principle and getting closer, a good fit timing wise and look forward to working with.

Comes now, Commissioner Repay, stating, "It was quite fortuitous of us to have all of us have been working on different projects like this, and yet they're not types of projects that attract a lot of attention to people immediately impacted, so these projects are extremely impactful to water quality, environmental, property values, all things that are super important for the Board of Commissioners who care about what happens in the unincorporated areas, but they're not as esthetically pleasing as a Bridge or a Park and I'm sure we're going to do ground breakings and ribbon cuttings, but it just won't have the impact esthetically as the others but that doesn't limit their impact, and for those reasons we really focused on these, you'll see that there's a lot of contingency money, for project scope that may change, we want to get as many properties out of a septic situation and into a treated sewer, I would commend the Gary Sanitary District and the City of Gary for their assistance with us so far and we continue to move forward with the stuff on Calumet Township side and we just look forward to working with the County Council that they accept our plan, a draft is expected by November meeting, but this is another kind of way to get it out in the open, and move forward, send them a plan tell them what our intents are and then they allow us to move forward with these as quickly as possible, thank you both for attending and we will resume back to regular order, if you would Matt Fech", end discussion

LAKE COUNTY, INDIANA Section 3 Understanding

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) issued regulations that provide the directive to creative job opportunities for low-income persons when HUD funds are expended on a construction project. These regulations are known as Section 3 policy. The purpose of the Section 3 policy is to ensure that the employment and other economic opportunities generated by Federal financial assistance for housing and community development programs shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed toward low and very low-income persons.

Section 3 covered projects are construction, reconstruction, conversion, or rehabilitation of housing, including reduction and abatement of lead based paint hazards, or other public construction which includes building and improvements assisted with HUD housing and community development assistance. Section 3 covered contracts do not include contracts for purchase of supplies and materials. However, whenever a contract for materials includes the installation of the materials, the contract constitutes a Section 3 covered contract.

Fund recipients and contractors must show compliance with the numerical goals set forth by the regulations. The numerical goals for new hires apply only to the number of new hires generated because of the financial assistance of the HUD programs. The numerical goals are not absolute numerical requirements. They are goals that each recipient and contractor should try to reach. The goals, if not met, do not trigger sanctions against the recipient or contractor. However, if challenged on the issue of compliance with Section 3, the recipient or contractor should be ready to demonstrate that they tried to reach these goals. The goals are as follows:

30% of all covered new hires for the year FY 2021

In addition, recipients and contractors are required to show compliance with the goal that at least 10% of any building trade activity which is subcontracted, and 3% of non building trade activity (construction management, etc.), is awarded to eligible Section 3 business concerns.

Further information regarding these requirements may be found in the Federal Regulations at 24 CFR 135 and the Lake County Section 3 Plan.

- H. To maintain records including copies of correspondence, memoranda, etc., which document that all of the above affirmative action steps have been taken.
